Celebrating 40 years of enabling student success

This year, as a newly-designated university, Capilano welcomed 6,700 credit students and another 7,000 non-credit students to three campuses in North Vancouver, Squamish and Sechelt.

When Capilano College opened in 1968, the world was in turmoil. In the United States, Martin Luther King and Robert Kennedy were assassinated. Demonstrators around the globe were denouncing the war in Vietnam. The Beatles released *The White Album*, but cracks were beginning to show within the world's greatest pop band, marking the beginning of the end of a musical dynasty.

Back home, Canada voted in its 15th prime minister, Pierre Elliott Trudeau,

and British Columbia's own Nancy Greene won both a gold and silver medal in alpine skiing at the X Olympic Winter Games held in Grenoble, France. At only seven years old, Wayne Gretzky was already displaying his hockey greatness, playing at a level far above his peers.

That same year, 784 students enrolled in classes at Capilano College. This year, as a newly-designated university, Capilano welcomed 6,700 credit students and another 7,000 non-cred-
