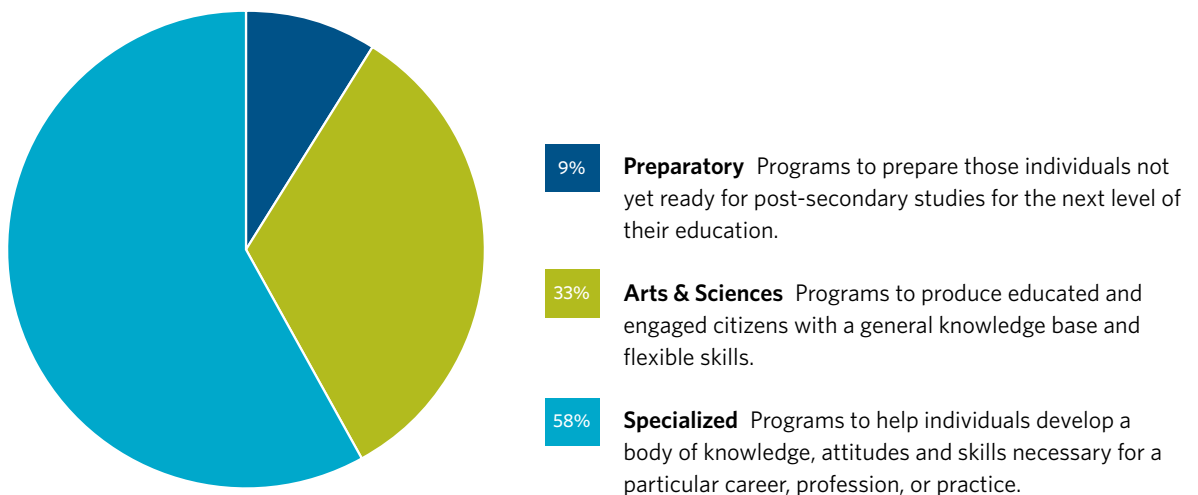

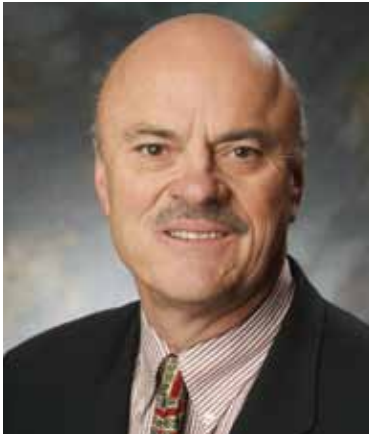

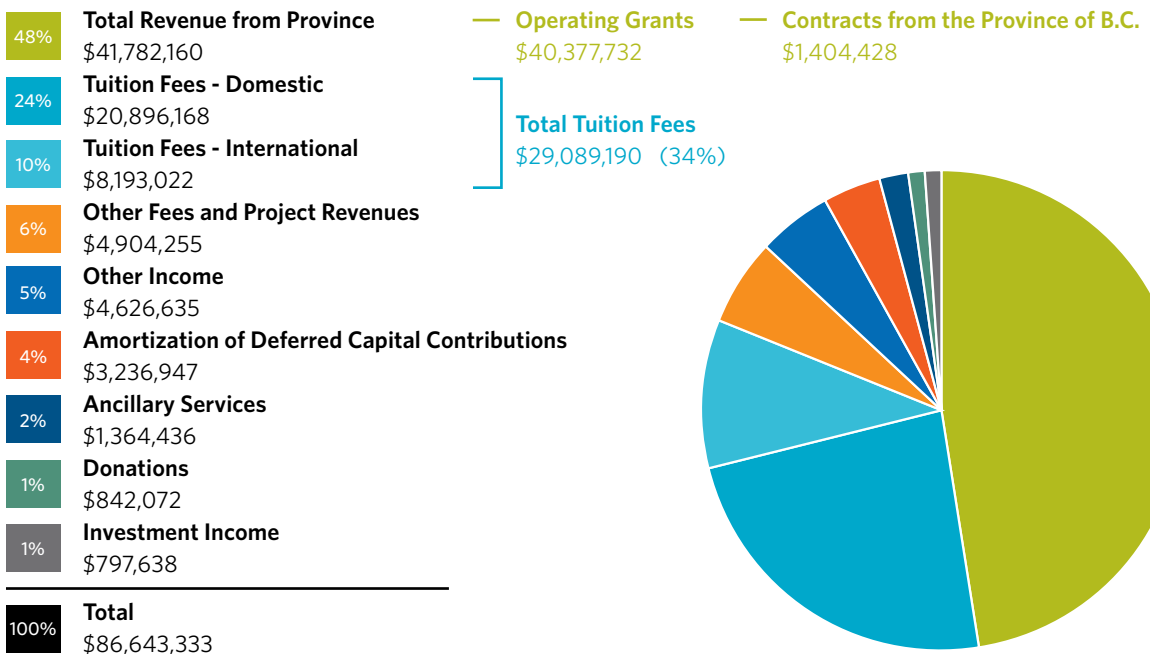

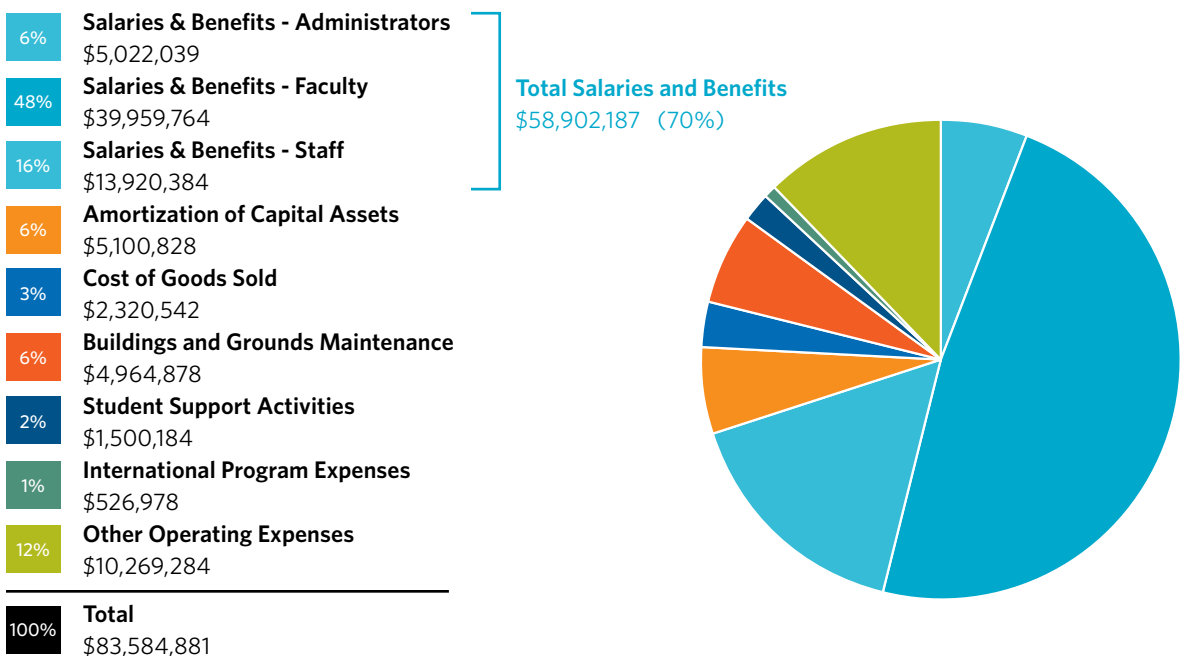

Distinguished Alumni Awards

Mark Watson

Currently assistant coach with the San Jose Earthquakes soccer team, Mark is pursuing his dream of coaching at the highest level in North America. While studying Arts and Sciences at Cap, Mark was instrumental in helping the Capilano Blues win provincial and national titles. Mark is an impressive record holder, earning the second most Senior Club Appearances in the history of the Canadian team, and playing the most games for the Canadian Olympic team. As a coach, he holds the record of being the youngest coach at every top level of competition (college, professional and national).

Cory Weeds

Capilano Jazz Studies graduate Cory Weeds' name symbolizes nearly every role on the Vancouver jazz scene: musician, record producer, radio host, agent and jazz club owner. His highly successful Cellar Jazz Club has evolved into Vancouver's only full-time jazz club and his record label, *Cellar Live*, showcases the best Canadian and international jazz talent. Cory has contributed greatly to the cultural life of Vancouver music lovers, and has made significant contributions to the artistic lives of Vancouver's jazz community.

President's Service Award

Pat Dejong

Pat Dejong served Capilano as a member and Chair of the University Board, and as a member of the Foundation Board for 12 years. Currently an executive with BMO, she is known for her fondness for Capilano, her commitment to its values, and her skill in leading the governance of the Board, in particular during its first year as a university.

Awards for Excellence in Empowering Learning

Doug Abercrombie

Retiring head coach of the Capilano Blues Women's Soccer program, Doug has been an inspirational leader for female student athletes for the past 16 years. Under his coaching, the women's teams dominated the sport at the national level from 1974 to 1999 and won eight provincial titles. As well as being a prolific coach, Doug was also an influential mentor, advocating for success in the classroom. His teams won several academic achievement awards, including the top average team grade point average.

One to Watch Awards

Deanne Lazaruk

After graduating with a certificate in Mountain Bike Operations, Deanne was hired by the International Mountain Biking Association on the first Canadian Trail Care Crew. Deanne also obtained a National Coaching Certification Program Level 4 Cycling designation — an extremely challenging designation that few women in Canada achieve. She has become an ambassador for Canadian mountain biking, bringing communities together through her education in sustainable trail building. Trail users are encouraged to become stewards of the land, building legacies that provide outdoor recreational opportunities for generations.

Krissi Bucholtz

At the age of 19, Krissi Bucholtz had the clarity of vision and determination to start a non-governmental organization that gives voice to the young women in Sierra Leone. The Capilano Global Stewardship graduate founded PEOPLE (Planning for the Elimination of Poverty through Love and Education) to provide mentoring and counselling programs to youth. Through her work, she is helping to bring HIV/AIDS education, peer mentoring and university scholarship programs to an area of the world where people have endured unimaginable hardship.

Sean Aiken

Sean Aiken didn't have a clear road map of what might be his best career option after completing a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from Cap. The 4.0 grade point average valedictorian decided to take his uncertainty on the road to discover his passion. The result: working at 52 jobs over a year. The jobs ranged from bungee jumping to stock trading, and he trekked more than 74,000 km in the process. Sean wrote a book about his adventure, *The One-Week Job Project*, and further launched the *One-Week Job Project Summer Program*, inspiring students to follow their passions through a journey similar to his own.

Janet MacDonald

For 35 years, Janet has enthusiastically nurtured a learning environment for students, as well as an enriching environment for children at Capilano's Children's Centre. Manager of Child Care Services since 1996, she made the Children's Centre the heart of the North Vancouver campus by opening its doors to Capilano students, and to educators from around the world who came to observe the Centre's innovative practices.
