## **CAPILANO EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS (CAPX)**

The Capilano Excellence Scholarships are the premier entrance scholarships awarded by Capilano University. These scholarships are awarded to high school graduates who have demonstrated excellence in academics and other endeavours and have shown leadership in their school and community. CAPX scholarships are in the form of a tuition fee waiver (domestic standard per credit fees) plus tuition surcharges for a full academic year of studies (two terms) and are renewable for up to three additional academic years (for a total of eight terms). There will be ten scholarships available each year.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or international students approved to study at Capilano University. Applicants must have a minimum high school grade point average (GPA) of 80 percent and enroll in 12 credits or more at the 100-level or higher at Capilano University for the fall term. *To renew this scholarship, a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 is required.*

**NOTE:** Students admitted as mature students who have not graduated from high school are not eligible.

Applicants must complete the CAPX application form available on the Capilano University Financial Aid and Awards web site at [www.capilanou.ca/financial-aid](http://www.capilanou.ca/financial-aid) and submit by the application deadline.

## **CAPILANO ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS (CAPA)**

The Capilano Achievement Scholarships are entrance scholarships awarded by Capilano University. These scholarships are awarded to high school graduates who have demonstrated strong academic standing and leadership in their school and community. CAPA scholarships are in the form of a tuition waiver (domestic standard per credit fees) plus tuition surcharges to a maximum of \$1500 for the fall term following award notification or in the term during which the student's program starts if other than the fall term. One scholarship per secondary school listed below will be awarded each year. Recipients are selected from the list of students attending these secondary schools who have applied to Capilano University.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Candidates must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. Candidates must have a minimum high school grade point average (GPA) of 80 percent and enroll in 12 credits or more at the 100-level or higher at Capilano University for the term in which the scholarship is granted.

### **APPLICATION**

No application is required. Contact your secondary school counselors for additional information. All applicants to Capilano University from the secondary schools listed are automatically considered for the CAPA scholarships. Names of eligible applicants to Capilano University are forwarded to their respective secondary schools in spring and scholarship selections will be made.

### **CAPILANO PROGRAM AWARDS (CAPP)**

The Capilano Program Awards are awarded by Capilano University. These awards are issued to high school graduates entering Capilano University directly from high school or students transferring from another post-secondary program. CAPP awards are in the form of a tuition waiver (domestic standard per credit fees) plus tuition surcharges to a maximum of \$1500 for the fall term following award notification or in the term during which the student's program starts if other than the fall term. One award per program area listed below will be awarded each year\*.

**NOTE:** A maximum of \$750 is awarded to a Health Care Assistant Certificate student each intake of the program (fall and spring).

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Candidates must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. Candidates must have a minimum high school grade point average (GPA) of 70 percent if entering directly from high school or a minimum GPA of 2.5 if transferring from another post-secondary institution. Candidates must enroll in 12 credits or more at the 100-level or higher at Capilano University for the term in which the award is granted. Program eligibility requirements may differ with each program.

### **APPLICATION**

No application is required. All eligible applicants to Capilano University programs listed below are automatically considered for the CAPP awards.

## **CAPILANO UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE AWARD**

The Capilano University Entrance Award endowment fund was established to ensure students eligible to attend Capilano University are able to access the necessary financial assistance to do so.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. Applicants must have attended a Canadian secondary school or CEGEP and achieved a minimum high school grade point average (GPA) of 75 percent in the graduating year which must not have ended later than 18 months prior to the beginning of the academic year at Capilano University. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need. Successful applicants must enroll in the first year of a full time diploma or degree program (no longer than 4 year duration) in a minimum 12 credits for the term in which the award is granted.

Applicants must complete the Capilano University Entrance Award application form available on the Capilano University Financial Aid and Awards web site at [www.capilanou.ca/financial-aid](http://www.capilanou.ca/financial-aid) and submit by the application deadline.

## **ENROLMENT SERVICES ENTRANCE BURSARY**

The employees of the Enrolment Services department of Capilano University established this annual bursary to support Capilano University students during their first term of studies.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents approved to study at Capilano University. Applicants must be new students enrolling in their first term at Capilano University. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need. Successful applicants must enroll in a minimum of 9 credits at the 100-level or higher for the fall term or 6 credits for students with permanent disabilities who have been approved by Disability Services at Capilano University.

## **FAIRFAX FINANCIAL HOLDINGS LIMITED ENTRANCE AWARD (RENEWABLE AWARD)**

The Fairfax Financial Holdings Limited Entrance Award was established by the Sixty Three Foundation to assist students entering first year of a full time diploma or undergraduate degree program at Capilano University. This award will assist eligible students for whom the cost of pursuing a post secondary education would be a serious impediment. Two awards will be available each year valued at \$3500 each. This award is renewable for a subsequent academic year for recipients that maintain award eligibility. The award is not payable, or will be reduced and/or pro-rated as appropriate, if the recipient receives remuneration pursuant to a co-op (or similar) program.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents and not be previous recipients of the Fairfax award. Applicants must have attended a Canadian secondary school or CEGEP and achieved a minimum high school grade point average (GPA) of 75 percent in the graduating year which must not have ended later than 18 months prior to the beginning of the academic year at Capilano University. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need. Successful applicants must enroll in the first year of a full time diploma or degree program (no longer than 4 year duration) in a minimum 9 credits for the term in which the award is granted. To renew, a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required and the applicant must have attended full time studies in their program at Capilano University during the immediate preceding academic year.

## **THE MARGEAUX TRAILBLAZER AWARD**

Dr. Kris Bulcroft, President of Capilano University and her husband, Dr. Rick Bulcroft, Associate Professor at Western Washington University, established this award to support students (male or female) redefining stereotypically gender-specific education. Kris is a recipient of several Fulbright Awards for research and teaching in Canada and Slovakia. Rick was a Senior Fulbright Scholar at the University of Dar es Salaam in Tanzania. The Fulbright programs were established to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and other countries through the exchange of persons, knowledge, and skills. The two have also co-authored several books together, one of them based on an interdisciplinary research project looking at North American honeymoon rituals as they relate to changing cultural conceptions of marriage and family life. Kris and Rick have established this award to encourage students wishing to pursue a nontraditional career path and have done so in honour of their beloved companion Margeaux.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. Applicants must have applied to a program at Capilano University that is non-traditional for their gender. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need. Successful applicants must enroll in the first year of their program in a minimum of 12 credits at the 100-level or higher for the fall term.

Patsy has been the recipient of many awards and recognitions including the Order of British Columbia and the Order of Canada. Crissy George is Patsy's sister, also born in Kerala, India. Crissy is a well accomplished Social Worker specializing in Mental Health and Public Health fields. Her volunteer work in international development has taken her to Bangladesh and Belize where she has combined her two fields of interest, namely teaching and community work. Crissy has a Masters degree in Education and a Masters degree in Social Work. Crissy has been a lifelong volunteer promoting neighbourhood houses, children's services, multi-culturalism and anti-racism policies. She has been recognized for such. As immigrants to Canada, the George sisters are grateful for the opportunities they have had in Canada. They are both Canadian citizens.

Applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. Applicants must be female black students from African origin now residing in BC. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need. Successful applicants must enroll in the first year of their program in a minimum of 12 credits at the 100-level or higher for the fall term.

## **ZAYED GAMIET MEMORIAL AWARD**

The United Nations Association in Canada (UNA-Canada), a national charitable organization established in 1946 whose mandate is to engage the Canadian public in the work of the United Nations and the critical international issues facing Canadians, has established this permanent fund in honour of Zayed Gamiet. Zayed moved from South Africa with his family in 1967 and loved Canada for its freedom and inclusiveness. He was a lawyer, founding member of the South Africa Action Coalition (SAAC) and among others, a member of the United Nations Association. He fought tirelessly for the underprivileged and disenfranchised. Zayed was a regular participant in the yearly peace marches in Vancouver, influencing his children and grandchildren to march with him. In 1997, he was awarded the Civic Peace Prize jointly by the City of Vancouver and the United Nations Association for his work in promoting peace.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Candidates must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or international students approved to study at Capilano University. Candidates must be male, entering the Global Stewardship program at Capilano University. The essay submission with the candidate's application to the Global Stewardship program and the program selection interview will be used to evaluate candidates for this award. Successful candidates must enroll in the first year of Global Stewardship following award selection.

### **APPLICATION**

No application is required. Candidates will be nominated by Faculty from the Global Stewardship program at Capilano University.

## **CANADIAN DAUGHTERS' LEAGUE — MARJORY AND GEORGE RISTE ENTRANCE AWARD**

Successful candidates must enroll in the Jazz Studies program at Capilano University in a minimum of 12 credits at the 100-level or higher for the fall term.

No application is required. Recipients are selected by faculty from the Jazz Studies program at Capilano University.
